Introduction

As part of our commitment to inclusion and equality, this plan sets out how the school intends to make reasonable adjustments (with anticipatory readiness) to ensure that pupils and adults with additional needs and/or disabilities are not directly/indirectly discriminated against at any time. We will consider all stakeholders, including pupils, siblings, parents/carers, family members, staff and visitors and a full range of visible/invisible barriers, such as physical needs (e.g. mobility, sight, hearing), developmental needs (e.g. reading and writing ability), sensory needs (e.g. enhanced or diminished), communication needs (e.g. autism, speech/language difficulties, English as an additional language), and mental health needs (e.g. anxiety).

Monitoring and Reviewing

It is the Headteacher and Governing Body's responsibility to review this policy every three years (earlier if necessary) and to monitor the effectiveness of this plan by:

- Ensuring sufficient resources are allocated to enable the plan to be implemented according to the agreed timescales.
- Monitoring the progress of children with additional needs and disabilities, relative to the progress made by others.
- Provide staff training for staff to identify and address accessibility needs, including raising awareness of disability discrimination to support anticipatory readiness.
- Assess the impact of this plan through regular review of the actions described overleaf.
